The political activism of life long Detroit and MCHR board member Frank Joyce began with the civil rights movement. He joined the Northern Student Movement (NSM) in the early 1960's. Frank helped found People Against Racism (PAR) and has been involved in labor, anti-racist, human rights and peace campaigns ever since.
